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## 1. Introduction to Ube City

### Location and Natural Environment

Ube City is in southwestern Yamaguchi Prefecture, situated to the west of Honshu. The city is bordered by Sanyo Onoda City to the west, Yamaguchi City to the east, Mine City to the north, and the Seto Inland Sea to the south.

Major railroads include the JR Sanyo Main Line and JR Ube Line, which run east-west. The Sanyo Expressway crosses the city's center, providing road-based access. Other access includes Ube Port, a major coastal facility, and Yamaguchi-Ube Airport, which is located close to the city center. The city, therefore, has excellent access to land, sea, and air-based transport.

The city's proximity to the Seto Inland Sea creates a mild climate with relatively little rainfall. The hills north of the city's center are rich in nature and are home to various plants and animals, while Ube City's southern portion borders the ocean. It is, therefore, blessed with both mountain and coastal environments. Additionally, the Majime and Koto Rivers, which run through the city, provide valuable waterfront environments.

### 3. Important Information for Life in Ube City

#### (1) Procedures that can be Performed at Ube City Hall

##### 1. Resident Registration (Front Desk, Public Affairs Division, Tel: 0836-34-8238)

###### A. Moving to and from Japan

If you have mid/long-term resident status (spouse of a Japanese national, fixed/permanent resident, etc.) and have started living in Ube City, or if you have newly obtained mid/long-term resident status, please register at the Public Affairs Division at city hall. Registration must be completed within 14 days of the date you start living in Ube City.

Note 1: Only for moving in.

Note 2: Not required if this can be confirmed through the Moving-Out Certificate.

## B. Relocating

If you relocate within Ube City, you must report your change of address. Notification of change of residence must be made within 14 days of the date you start living there.

## C. Moving/Leaving Japan

You must notify Ube City if you leave the country or move to another municipality. You will need a Moving-Out Certificate (*tenshutsu shomeisho*) to register with your new municipality.

## D. Issuing Certificates of Residence

Receive a "Request for Copy of Certificate of Residence" at the service counter and fill in the name and address of the person whose certificate you are requesting, as well as your name and address.

Applicants will be required to verify their identity at the service counter.

2. Marriage/Divorce (Family Registry Desk, Public Affairs Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8237)

A. Marriage

Under Japanese law, marriages must be registered at a city hall/municipal office for the marriage to be legally established. The following documents are required, but additional information may be requested.

For more information on how to fill out the form and on what documents are required, contact the Public Affairs Division at Ube City Hall.

Documents written in a language other than Japanese must be accompanied by a Japanese translation. (The Japanese translation must include the date of translation and the translator's name and address.) Marriage registration requires two adult witnesses.

Foreigners are also required to notify their embassy or consulate separately in order to register their marriage in their home country.

Note: If a foreign national changes their name after marriage to a Japanese citizen, an application must be made to change the listing on their Japanese spouse's family register. The Japanese spouse is required to make this application, providing proof of the name change through translations of applicable documents.

B. Divorce

Under Japanese law, divorces must be registered at a city hall/municipal office for the divorce to be legally established.

The required documents will differ depending on the nationalities involved, so please contact the Public Affairs Division at Ube City, as well as your country's consulate/embassy.

3. Births/Deaths (Family Registry Desk, Public Affairs Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8237)

A. Births

When a child is born, the birth must be reported within 14 days of the date of birth. Birth registration forms can be received at the hospital where the child was born, alongside a birth certificate.

Note: You must obtain a residence permit to allow your child to continue to live in Japan. Please apply for a residence permit at the Shimonoseki Branch Office of the Hiroshima Regional Immigration Bureau (Tel: 083-261-1211) within 30 days of birth.

B. Deaths

When a family member or someone living with you dies, a death notice must be filed within seven days of learning of the death. You must also notify your home country's embassy or consulate. "Notification of Death" forms can be received with the death certificate prepared by the hospital where the death occurred or by the doctor who confirmed the death.

Note: You must submit the deceased's Residence Card or special permanent resident certificate to the Shimonoseki Branch Office of the Hiroshima Regional Immigration Bureau (Tel: 083-261-1211) within 14 days of death.

4. Inkan seal registration (Front Desk, Public Affairs Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8238)

Seals are an important item that serve the same purpose as a signature.

For example, a contract to buy a house or a car may require you to have a registered seal (*jitsuin*) and a seal registration certificate. A registered seal is a seal registered with the city hall. Only one seal can be registered per person. Registered seals can only be used by a single individual.

Only seals with your name, alias, or name in katakana (as registered on your certificate of residence) can be used as registered seals.

You must be 15 years of age or older and be a registered resident of Ube City to register your seal.

A "seal registration card" will be issued when you register your seal. Ensure you bring your seal registration card with you when required.

5. National Pension (Administration and Pension Desk, National Insurance and Pension Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8292)

The National Pension is a public pension plan administered by the government. People between the ages of 20 and 60 who are registered as residents in Japan must be enrolled in the National Pension (excluding members of employee pension plans and their dependent spouses).

The public pension includes an old-age pension, as well as a disability pension and survivor's pension that are provided in case of emergencies.

The National Pension Insurance premium is about 17,000 yen per month. If you have been paying the premiums for at least six months, you may be able to receive a lump-sum withdrawal payment by making a request within two years of your departure.

There is also a system to exempt or defer the payment of insurance premiums for people with low income who have difficulty paying the premiums (requires approval).



6. National Health Insurance (Assessment Desk, National Insurance and Pension Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8287)

National Health Insurance is a social security system that provides peace of mind by allowing all residents of Japan to receive medical treatment in the event of illness or injury.

Those who will be living in Japan for three or more months, are under the age of 75, and are not covered by their workplace's medical insurance must pay for National Health Insurance. Premiums are determined by income and other factors. Payment is compulsory.

You must notify the city office if you want to join or withdraw from the National Health Insurance system.

If you fail to enroll, you may have to pay the full amount of your medical bills in the event of a sudden illness or injury. When seeing a doctor at a hospital or other medical facility, you must bring your "My Number Health Insurance Card" or "Certificate of Eligibility." By providing the "My Number Health Insurance Card" or "Certificate of Eligibility," you can receive medical treatment at a rate that is appropriate for your age and income.

You may also be able to receive benefits for medical expenses in case of birth or death or if you have a high medical expense by applying to the city hall.

People over 40 years of age who are enrolled in the National Health Insurance scheme are entitled to specific health checkups for the early detection of lifestyle-related diseases and the prevention of serious illnesses.

For more information on procedures and for details of the system, please contact the National Insurance and Pension Division, Ube City Hall.

7. Medical Care System for Older Senior Citizens (Older Senior Citizens' Medical Care Desk, National Insurance and Pension Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8343)

The Medical Care System for Older Senior Citizens is designed to provide peace of mind for the elderly. All persons 75 years of age or older who have an address in Ube City (except for short-term visitors whose period of stay is three months or less or those receiving public assistance, etc.) are covered by this insurance.

People between the ages of 65 and 74 can also apply for and enroll in the program if they have a disability (e.g., Physical Disability Certificate Levels 1 to 3).

If you present your "My Number Health Insurance Card" or "Certificate of Eligibility" when you visit a medical facility, your co-payment ratio for medical expenses paid will be between 10-30%. Co-payment and premium percentages are determined by income and other factors.

8. Nursing Care Insurance (Nursing Care Insurance Desk, Nursing Care Insurance Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8297)

The nursing care insurance system is designed to support a society taking care of elderly individuals.

Those who are over 40 years old and have lived in Japan for more than three months are eligible.

Individuals requiring nursing care due to being bedridden or due to dementia or that require support in day-to-day life can apply. Those deemed eligible can receive nursing care services with a co-payment of 10-30%. Co-payment and premium percentages are determined by income and other factors.

9. Welfare for Individuals with Disabilities (Disability Certificate and Medical Care Desk, Disabled Citizen's Welfare Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8314)  
A variety of support is provided for people with psychological, intellectual, and physical disabilities, including consultations, benefits, medical care, disability welfare services, and access to welfare facilities. Those with physical disabilities are entitled to receive a Physical Disability Certificate, those with intellectual disabilities are entitled to a Rehabilitation Certificate, and those with mental illnesses that limit their daily and social life are entitled to a Mental Health and Welfare Certificate.
10. Child Care (Benefits/Medical Care), Single Parent Families  
(Allowance and Medical Care Desk, Child Policy Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8330)  
Families with children younger than high school age are eligible for a child allowance and subsidies for medical expenses. Single-parent families with a child 18 or younger can receive a child support allowance and a subsidy system for single-parent family medical expenses, and families raising a child under 20 years of age with psychological, intellectual, or physical disabilities are entitled to special child support payments.  
Each system has different income limits. For more information on the procedures and systems, please contact the Child Policy Division at Ube City Hall.
11. Pregnancy and Child Care  
(Child-raising Support Division (Welfare Fureai Center), Tel: 0836-31-1732)  
If you become pregnant, your health care provider will provide you with a Pregnancy Notification Form. Bring this form to the Comprehensive Support for Child Rearing Generations Center "UBE KODOMO KATEI CENTER UbeHapi" at the Maternal and Child Health Desk, Child-raising Support Division. You will receive a Maternal and Child Health Handbook (Mother and Child Health Handbook) and a Pregnancy Health Examination Form.  
The Maternal and Child Health Handbook (Maternal and Child Health Handbook) records the progress of the pregnancy and childbirth, as well as the child's growth and development up to the point that they enter school. The handbook also records health checkups, vaccinations, and other important matters.  
Please contact us if you need a maternal and child health handbook in a foreign language.
12. Water and Sewerage (Operations Division Desk, Waterworks Bureau, Tel: 0836-21-2304)  
Contact the Waterworks Bureau's Operations Division in advance if you would like to start/stop receiving municipal water. Once service commences, water bills are paid once every two months. If your residence has access to sewerage, you will also pay a sewer usage fee every two months, depending on the amount of water used.
13. Municipal Housing (Municipal Housing Desk, Housing Planning Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8427)  
Municipal housing is managed by Ube City, and rent is determined by income.  
Applications for municipal housing tenancy can be made in April, July, October, and January of each year.  
If you are interested in moving in, please contact the Municipal Housing Desk, Housing Planning Division at Ube City Hall.

#### 14. Taxes

There are two types of taxes: those that are paid to the country and those that are paid to the prefecture or municipality.

Individuals and corporations are subject to income tax (national tax) and residential tax (prefectural/municipal tax) on their income, while buildings, land, and other real estate are subject to property tax (municipal tax) and city planning tax (municipal tax). Cars and motorcycles are also subject to an automobile tax (prefectural) and a light vehicle tax (municipal), depending on their engine displacement.

All of these taxes have a fixed deadline for payment. If you miss this deadline, you will be sent a reminder, plus a reminder fee or late fee. Your property may be forcefully repossessed if you don't pay your taxes when prompted to do so.

- Income Tax (Ube Tax Office, Tel: 0836-21-3131)

You must file a tax return with the tax office to determine your yearly income tax (national tax) from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

Those whose annual salary exceeds 20 million yen, those whose monthly salary is not deducted from their wages, those who receive a salary from more than one employer, and those who have income in addition to their salary (except for income other than salary of 200,000 yen or less), etc. must file tax returns between February 15 and March 15 of the following year.

Please contact the Ube Tax Office for more information on the documents required for filing a tax return.

- Residential Tax (Municipal Tax and Prefectural Tax) (Tax Administration Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8187)

Depending on your income from the previous year, you must pay a combination of municipal and prefectural taxes to the city where you lived on January 1 as a residential tax.

If you have not had residential tax deducted from your salary, you will receive a tax notice from city hall every June. Use this tax notice to pay your residential taxes.

- Vehicle Taxes (by type) (Yamaguchi Prefecture Ube Prefectural Taxation Office, Tel: 0836-21-2118)

If you own a car (excluding a light vehicle) on April 1, you are required to pay an automobile tax (the prefectural tax) to the prefecture. You will receive a tax notice from the prefectural tax office in May of each year. Use this tax notice to pay your car tax (by category).

To undergo a vehicle inspection (*shaken*), you will need a receipt (tax payment certificate). Please keep your receipts in a safe place.

- Light Vehicle Tax (by type) (Tax Administration Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8197)

On April 1 of each year, people who own motorcycles, light vehicles (see notes), etc., must pay a

light vehicle tax (by type municipal tax) to the city. You can pay this tax using the tax notice you receive from the city each May.

The "Tax Payment Certificate (for Vehicle Inspection) for Light Vehicle Tax (by Type)" that you received when you paid the tax may be needed when you undergo a vehicle inspection (*shaken*) for your light vehicle, so please keep it in a safe place.

Note: light vehicles are three and four-wheeled vehicles up to 660 cc displacement with yellow license plates. (May not always be yellow, due to being a commemorative license plate, etc.)

- Property Tax and City Planning Tax (Property Tax Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8191)

On January 1 of each year, people who own fixed assets (land, buildings, depreciable assets (machinery, equipment and facilities used for business purposes, structures (other than houses), vehicles, ships, etc., tools, equipment, and fixtures)) in Ube City must pay a fixed asset tax and city planning tax (tax imposed on land and buildings in certain taxation areas in the city) to the city. You can pay your taxes using the tax notice you receive from City Hall in April each year.

Please contact us if there is a change in your taxable fixed assets due to sale or demolition.

- Designating a Tax Administrator

You must designate a tax administrator (*nozei kanrinin*) to handle tax-related matters after you leave the country. This individual must be living in Japan.

[Paying Taxes]

Insurance and usage fees and taxes can be paid at financial institutions in the city, at the city hall main office, civic centers, and convenience stores throughout the city. You will need your payment slip to pay.

15. Individual Number Cards (My Number) (City Hall My Number Promotion Division Tel: 0836-34-8264)

- My Number

My Numbers (identification numbers similar to social security numbers) are assigned to people living in Japan. Each person has a unique number. You will receive an "Individual Number Notice" by registered mail within around one month of notifying us of your move to Ube City.

- My Number Card

A plastic IC card that allows you to verify your individual number and identity. It also provides access to a variety of government services. These cards are issued upon application. There is no initial issuance fee.

When your period of stay is changed due to an updated residence card status, please apply for a My Number card expiration date extension at city hall.

## (2) Private Sector Procedures

### 1. Electricity

Check with your real estate agent or landlord for details on using electricity.

If you want to apply directly, please contact Chugoku Electric Power Co.'s Ube Sales Center (Tel: 0120-613-270). Fees are billed on a monthly basis.

### 2. Gas

Check with your real estate agent or landlord if you want to use gas.

If you want to apply directly, contact a gas company or gas dealer.

Check with your gas company or gas dealer for rates and payment options.

### 3. Cell Phones

Cell phones can be purchased at a cell phone store.

Please speak to the store for payment options.

### 4. NHK Fees

(Contracts... Tel: 0120-151515, Receiving Fees... Tel: 0570-077-077)

NHK is a public broadcaster. Anyone who owns a television must pay a subscription fee to NHK.

Please contact NHK for information on contract procedures and payment methods.

### 5. Postal Service

If you notify the post office of your new address when you move, your mail will be delivered to your new address for one year from the date of submission (only available for addresses within Japan).

### (3) Other Important Information

#### 1. Health Management (Health Promotion Division (Ube City Public Health Center) Tel: 0836-31-1777)

Take the following steps to maintain your physical and mental health:

- Get regular health checkups.
- Prevent infectious diseases and avoid seasonal illnesses with vaccinations.
- If you have concerns regarding your physical or mental health, please consult the Ube City Public Health Center.

#### 2. Medical Care

Medical consultations are available at any time. Decide in advance which hospital near your residence you will use in emergencies.

(Flow of treatment)

1. At Reception	Tell the receptionist whether this is your first visit or not. For your first visit, you will need to fill out a medical questionnaire and provide your insurance card and other documentation. From your second visit onwards, you can either provide your consultation card or write your name in the receptionist's book.
2. Medical Examination	When your name is called, you will enter the examination room and receive treatment.
3.Payment/ Receipt of Prescriptions	Payment will be made at the cashier's desk after treatment. In some cases, you may be given medication, but in most cases, you will receive a prescription. Take this prescription to the pharmacy to pick up your medication. You will need to pay for the medication. If you receive ongoing treatment, make sure you know the date of your next visit.

Note: If you have any treatment limitations related to religion or pre-existing medical conditions, please consult with your doctor before starting treatment.

When your local hospital is closed or for emergency treatment on holidays and at night, you can call the Ube City Holiday and Night Emergency Clinic (Tel: 0836-31-1099).

#### 3. Finding Work

If you want to work in Japan, you must obtain a status of residence that allows you to work, or you can apply to the Immigration Bureau (Shimonoseki Branch Office of the Hiroshima Regional Immigration Bureau Tel: 083-261-1211) to obtain permission to work with your current status. Ensure your residency status allows you to work before seeking a job.

Hello Work Ube (Tel: 0836-31-0164) can assist you in finding work.

#### 4. Transport

##### A. Buses

Take a numbered ticket from the machine installed inside the doors when you board. When you get off the bus, place the applicable fare for the ticket number (indicated at the front of the bus) in the farebox next to the driver's seat. The farebox doesn't provide change. Use the money changer installed nearby as required.

The next stop will be announced, so use the stop button to let the driver know when you want to get off.

##### B. Trains

Before boarding, check the fare on the fare chart and purchase a ticket from the machine at the station. Give your ticket to the station staff at your destination station's ticket gate or put it in the collection box.

##### C. Taxis

Raise your hand to hail taxis you see or call a taxi company to have one dispatched to you. Tell the driver where you are going when you get in.

#### D. Traffic Rules

- In Japan, cars, motorcycles, and bicycles drive on the left side of the road, and pedestrians walk on the right side of the road.
- Driving under the influence of alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Driving without a license is strictly prohibited.
- Cell phone use is prohibited when driving.
- Insurance is required for cars or bicycles.

##### (Rules for Pedestrians)

- Stay on the sidewalk.
- If there are no sidewalks, stay on the right side of the road.
- Use crosswalks and pedestrian bridges to cross roads.
- Do not cross roads in areas where there are signs that prohibit crossing.
- At intersections with traffic lights, make sure that the pedestrian crossing light in your direction of travel has been turned green before crossing. Do not start crossing when the green pedestrian light is flashing.
- Always stop and wait when the alarm begins sounding at a railroad crossing or when the boom gate lowers.

##### (Rules for Cyclists)

- Whenever possible, keep in a single file to the left side of the road.
- Be sure to obey the traffic lights and do not cross through intersections when the light is red.
- Regularly service and check your bike's brakes and lights.
- Do not ride with two people, hold umbrellas, or ride side-by-side.
- Always turn on your lights at night.
- Do not leave your bike in areas that block traffic.
- Helmets are strongly encouraged. Please wear one when riding a bicycle.

##### (Rules for Cars and Motorcycles)

- Ensure you have your driver's license with you.
- All passengers must fasten their seat belts.
- Always wear a helmet when riding a motorcycle.
- Do not drive a car or motorcycle that has not been inspected (*shaken*) or that is uninsured.
- Do not park in areas where parking is prohibited.
- In the event of a traffic accident, be sure to contact the police (Tel: 110).



5. Neighborhood Associations (Community Development Promotion Desk, Civic Activity Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8233)

Neighborhood associations are voluntary organizations run by residents. Each community and housing complex in Ube has its own neighborhood association. The associations carry out various activities to ensure that residents can live safely and peacefully. For example, they clean up parks and streets, maintain garbage collection areas, conduct disaster prevention activities, and hold festivals and sports events to promote friendship among residents.

We encourage you to join your neighborhood association as they are often responsible for providing the "Koho Ube" circular (a document with announcements from local authorities that goes around each household in turn).

However, becoming a member means abiding by the rules, including the payment of membership fees.

For information on how to join neighborhood associations, membership fees, rules, etc., please check with the representative from your local neighborhood association.

If you would like to know who represents your local neighborhood association, please speak to your neighbors or the Community Development Promotion Desk, Civic Activity Division, at Ube City Hall.

6. Disposing of Garbage (Waste Management Division, Ube City Hall, Tel: 0836-34-8247)

Garbage collection days differ depending on your district. Check your district's "Garbage Collection Calendar" for details.

Ube City is making efforts to promote waste reduction and recycling, so please comply with all sorting and disposal rules. Furthermore, garbage placed outside designated areas is strictly punishable by law.

(Rules for Sorting and Disposing of Trash)

- Use garbage bags designated by Ube City.
- Put out garbage by 8:30 on the morning of the collection day.
- Dispose of your garbage at your designated place (garbage collection area).
- Sort garbage properly.

## 8. Driving (Yamaguchi Prefecture General Center Tel: 083-973-2900)

Those with foreign driver's licenses need one of the following to drive in Japan:

- A Japanese driver's license
- An International Driver's License in accordance with the Geneva Convention
- A driver's license from a country with special exceptions (Switzerland, Germany, France, Belgium, Monaco, and Taiwan)

Note: A translation of the driver's license issued by a consular agency or the Japan Automobile Federation must be kept on you at all times.

- Period during which you can drive

One year from the date of entry into Japan or the period of validity of the driver's license, whichever is shorter. (However, if a person on the Basic Resident Register leaves Japan and returns within a very short period of time (less than three months), the date of entry is the date of first entry into Japan.)

- Obtaining a Japanese Driver's License

If you have a foreign driver's license and meet the following conditions, you will be exempted from certain parts of the driving test (written test and practical test) after undergoing screening to confirm that you can drive in Japan.

- Those who have a valid foreign license and have lived in the foreign country for a total of 3 months or more after receiving the license.

#### 4. Emergencies

(1) Sickness, Injury: Fire/Ambulance Service (Tel: 119).

In the event of a sudden illness or serious injury, ask a friend or neighbor for help or call an ambulance (Tel: 119). When you call for an ambulance, tell them where they are needed as well as your name and phone number.

(2) Fire: Fire/Ambulance Service (Tel: 119).

In the event of a fire, yell out, "Fire!" (*kaji da!*) to let others know. Call the fire department at 119 and give them the location of the fire, your name, and phone number. If there is a large amount of smoke from a fire, or if you have difficulty putting out the fire by yourself, put a wet towel over your mouth and nose, get low to the floor, and immediately evacuate to a safe place.

Many of Japan's houses are made of wood. When a fire breaks out, it can spread quickly through the neighborhood.

Always ensure that you:

- Have a fire extinguisher at the ready.
- Get into the habit of ensuring you extinguish any flames before you go to bed or when you leave the house.
- Do not smoke in bed or carelessly dispose of cigarettes.
- To prevent fires caused by arson, do not leave flammable items outside your house.
- Do not leave the area when deep-frying food/heating oil.
- Do not play with fire.

Fires are more common in the winter because of the dry air. Ensure proper caution when using fire.

(3) Traffic accidents, crimes: (Tel: 110)

If you are the victim of a car accident or crime, contact the police and explain the situation.

#### (4) Earthquakes

Japan is prone to earthquakes. Make sure you know the safest place in your home, how to contact your family in case of an emergency, where to evacuate, and the phone number of your country's embassy or consulate.

Prepare the following in case of earthquakes:

- Keep flashlights, towels, a change of clothes, gloves, drinking water, food, first aid supplies, portable radio, masks, etc. in a backpack or other container that you can easily carry.
- Apply shatterproof film to windows and shelves to prevent injuries.
- Fix furniture to the wall to prevent injuries from collapsing bookcases, chests of drawers, and other furniture.
- If an earthquake occurs when indoors, use cushions or a heavy quilt to protect your head from falling objects and take shelter under a table. - When outdoors, be careful of falling objects, remain low to the ground in an open area away from buildings, walls made of brick or concrete blocks, utility poles, etc.
- When evacuating, wear shoes or slippers to avoid injury from broken glass.
- Always carry important documents such as your passport and residence card with you when you evacuate. Be aware that there may be ongoing aftershocks after major earthquakes.

#### (5) Heavy Rainfall During Rainy Season

There is an increased risk of mudslides and flooding due to heavy rainfall during the rainy season (*tsuyu*) in Japan (June to July each year). Please pay close attention to weather information and any notifications from the city.

#### (6) Typhoons/Storm Surges

Typhoons tend to approach and make landfall in the Japanese archipelago between August and October each year. When a typhoon approaches, landslides, flooding, and storms caused by heavy rainfall can cause extensive damage over large areas. Don't leave the house unnecessarily during a typhoon. Pay attention to weather information and notifications from the city. You should evacuate immediately if the city issues evacuation instructions for evacuation in your area. If you feel that you are in danger, try to evacuate voluntarily as soon as possible, even if an evacuation notice hasn't been issued, or ask for help from your neighbors.

Ube City has been severely damaged by storm surges on several occasions in the past. A storm surge is a phenomenon in which a typhoon or strong low-pressure system causes the sea level to rise to abnormally high levels near the coast. Check disaster hazard maps in advance and stay away from dangerous areas when a typhoon is approaching.

If a disaster strikes and you are in danger, use the evacuation shelters and emergency evacuation sites designated by Ube City. Not all shelters and emergency evacuation sites can be used to evacuate from all disasters. Check the city's website in advance for information on evacuation centers and emergency evacuation sites in the area. If you have any questions about shelters and emergency evacuation sites, please contact the Disaster Prevention and Crisis Management Division at Ube City Hall (Tel: 0836-34-8139).

Ube City publishes an easy-to-understand “Ube City Disaster Risk Reduction Guidebook” which details what to do in case of an emergency or disaster, what you can do in your daily life to prepare, and more. The “Ube City Disaster Risk Reduction Guidebook” is available in 6 languages, including English, (simplified) Chinese, Vietnamese, Indonesian, Tagalog, and easy Japanese.
